Congratulations on your grant of deferred action! You should have received your Employment Authorization Card (EAC) in the mail already. You now have a USCIS number (sometimes also called an "A" number), and it is printed on your EAC. **We ask that all clients send us a copy of their EAC for our files.** This will be helpful to you in the event you lose your EAC, because we will have a copy in our files.

Your grant of deferred action and employment authorization is valid for two years. President Obama has announced that he is committed to continuing the DACA program and renewing it after the initial two-year period. Therefore, it may be possible to renew your grant of deferred action at the end of two years. We recommend that you contact an immigration attorney ninety (90) days before the expiration of your deferred action and EAC.

Also, if you move at any time, you must inform USCIS of your new address. You may do so online at [www.uscis.gov](http://www.uscis.gov).

Although deferred action offers many benefits, deferred action is a temporary benefit that does not give you legal immigration status or lead to permanent residency. Also, you could lose deferred action if you:

- Travel outside the U.S. without applying for and receiving advance parole; or
- Engage in **any** criminal activity or become a member of a gang; or
- Are arrested and/or convicted of a crime; or
- Do not successfully graduate from high school or a GED program.

If you would like to travel outside the US, contact an immigration attorney immediately. If you commit a crime and are arrested and convicted, you may be placed in removal/deportation proceedings. If you are arrested, you should contact an immigration attorney immediately.

Now that you have deferred action and your EAC, here are some next steps:

- **Apply for a Social Security Number, 10-14 days after you receive your EAC.** You can find information about applying at <http://www.ssa.gov/pubs/10096.html#a0=1> or by going to your local social security administration office.

- **Obtaining a driver's license or state ID in DC, Maryland, or Virginia.** To find out whether you can obtain a license or ID in DC, Maryland, or Virginia, go to their respective websites – DC (<http://dmv.washingtondc.gov/main.shtm>) MD ([www.mva.maryland.gov](http://www.mva.maryland.gov)), VA (<http://www.dmv.state.va.us/>).
- **Stay aware of future immigration options for childhood arrivals and beware of immigration scams.** USCIS website ([www.uscis.gov](http://www.uscis.gov)) is regularly updated with information. We Own the Dream ([www.WeOwnTheDream.org](http://www.WeOwnTheDream.org)) is also a good resource for information. Go to [www.StopNotarioFraud.org](http://www.StopNotarioFraud.org) to learn about trustworthy immigration resources. And, please feel free to contact Hogar Immigrant Services as well.

Felicitaciones por la aprobación de su Acción Diferida. Usted debe haber recibido por correo su Permiso de Trabajo (EAC). Asimismo USCIS le ha asignado un número de extranjería (o número "A") que está impreso en su permiso de trabajo. Solicitamos a nuestros clientes que nos envíen una copia de su permiso de trabajo para nuestro archivo. Esto será muy útil en caso de que usted pierda su permiso pues nosotros ya tendríamos una copia en la oficina.

La aprobación de su acción diferida y autorización de empleo son válidas por dos años. El Presidente Obama anunció que se compromete a continuar y renovar el Programa DACA después de dos años de iniciado el proceso. Por lo tanto usted podrá renovar su acción diferida al término de los dos años. Le recomendamos que contacte un abogado de inmigración noventa (90) días antes de la fecha de expiración de su acción diferida y EAC.

Asimismo, si Usted se muda en algún momento, debe informar a USCIS de su nueva dirección. Puede hacerlo online en el sitio web [www.uscis.gov](http://www.uscis.gov).

Aunque la acción diferida ofrece muchos beneficios, éste es un beneficio temporal que no garantiza un status legal de inmigración o conlleva a una residencia permanente. Por otro lado, Usted podría perder su acción diferida si Usted:

- Viaja fuera de U.S. sin solicitar un permiso de viaje al gobierno; o,
- Se involucra en una actividad o pandilla criminal; o,
- No se gradúa satisfactoriamente de la escuela secundaria o del programa GED.

Si quisiera viajar fuera de U.S. contáctese con un abogado de inmigración inmediatamente. Si comete un crimen y es arrestado y declarado culpable, Usted podría ser procesado por deportación. Si Usted es arrestado, debe contactar un abogado de inmigración inmediatamente.

Ahora que ya tiene su acción diferida y su permiso de trabajo, estos son los pasos a seguir:

- Solicite un número de Seguro Social, dentro de 10-14 días después que haya recibido su permiso de trabajo. Puede encontrar información de cómo aplicar en <http://www.ssa.gov/pubs/10096.html#a0=1> o visitando la oficina de administración de seguro social en su localidad.
- Tramite su licencia de conducir o ID del estado, en DC, Maryland o Virginia. Para averiguar si tiene que tramitar su licencia en DC., Maryland

o Virginia, vaya al sitio web – DC

([www.mva.maryland.gov](http://www.mva.maryland.gov)), VA (<http://www.dmv.state.va.us/>).

- Manténganse informado sobre futuras opciones de inmigración para llegadas de menores de edad y tenga cuidado con fraudes de inmigración. La página web de USCIS ([www.uscis.gov](http://www.uscis.gov)) se actualiza constantemente con nueva información. Otra fuente de información muy buena es el sitio web *We Own the Dream* ([www.WeOwnTheDream.org](http://www.WeOwnTheDream.org)). Para informarse sobre recursos de inmigración confiables vaya al sitio web [www.StopNotarioFraud.org](http://www.StopNotarioFraud.org). Por favor no dude en contactar Hogar Immigrant Services también.
