

DACA: Deciding what to do

I am a DACA recipient

WARNING:

If a higher court reverses the injunction, USCIS could stop accepting and processing DACA requests. Therefore, DACA requesters risk losing the application fee or having the application rejected. Each DACA recipient should weigh these potential risks against the benefits of a DACA extension before deciding whether to apply and, if so, how early.
