Reasons (Include all pertinent facts concerning denial of application for admission, including use of altered, counterfeit or fraudulent document):

Subject, a 14-year old female, native and citizen of Mongolia, attempted entry as a B2 visitor for pleasure on January 19, 2003 at Los Angeles International Airport via United Airlines Flight #890 from Tokyo. She presented for inspection a Mongolian passport E#151691 containing a B2 NIV Foil #34860307 bearing the name of ZOLZAYA, Batjargal.

In her sworn statement, she admitted that the Mongolian passport she presented for inspection does not belong to her and that the passport was given to her by her Uncle ([REDACTED] A# [REDACTED]). It was also revealed that the subject was traveling with 2 other smugglers (adult Mongolians) and the supposedly Mongolian smuggler identified as her father's brother ([REDACTED]).

[REDACTED] is an unaccompanied minor who is coming to join her brother and grandmother, a resident of Korea, who is visiting the United States on a B2 visa. Subject is inadmissible into the United States under Section 212(a)(4)(A) and 212(a)(7)(A)(i)(I) of the INA. Subject is requesting that she be allowed to withdraw her application for admission in lieu of a 240 Removal Proceeding and remain in the custody of her grandmother until May 3, 2003. Subject and her grandmother are scheduled to depart on that day.

Aliens who appear inadmissible pursuant to section 235(b)(1) or inadmissible pursuant to 8 CFR 217.4 are not entitled to a hearing before an immigration judge.
